

A letter from Pr. Dana...

Friends in Christ,

Fall always feels like holy ground to me. The air shifts, the leaves show off, and the earth whispers, "change is possible." In the middle of it all, I can't help but hear Jesus' parable of the mustard seed.

You know the one—smallest of all seeds, yet it grows into something strong enough for birds to perch in its branches. That's God's kingdom. That's us. 

Supporting Our Neighbors through ICRH

Our church will again partner with the Isabella County Restoration House (ICRH) this fall and winter to support our neighbors experiencing homelessness. Our assigned weeks are:

- Sunday, October 5 Saturday, October 11, 2025
- Sunday, January 18 Saturday, January 24, 2026

A New Chapter for ICRH

In the past, ICRH relied on a rotating shelter model, where churches hosted guests overnight for a week at a time. Thanks to the blessing of a permanent shelter, our neighbors experiencing homelessness now have an address to receive mail and a consistent bed. They no longer need to move weekly between the day shelter and different host sites.

Local churches like ours are now called **Supporting Churches**. Instead of housing guests, we focus on providing meals, fellowship, and encouragement.

How We Can Help

During our support weeks, our main responsibilities include:

- 1. Serving Dinner (highest priority)
 - 3–4 volunteers (one serving as dishwasher)
 - 5:30 7:00 pm, with dinner served at 6:00 pm
 - Assist with serving and cleanup each night for our guests
 - After the main serving is complete, church members are encouraged to sit and eat with the guests to share fellowship and conversation
- 2. Providing the Meal (2nd priority for Sunday, Friday, and Saturday only)
 - Prepare and provide the dinner (main dish, sides, and dessert)
 - Meals can either be prepared at home and brought ready to serve or prepared in the shelter's kitchen.
 - If you would like to use the shelter's kitchen, please let me know ahead of time so I can help coordinate your access.
 - For October, local restaurants will provide meals on Monday–Thursday
- 3. Breakfast Setup and Cleanup
 - 2 volunteers
 - 7:00 9:00 am
 - Set out breakfast items and clean up afterward for our guests
- 4. Evening Fellowship
 - 2 volunteers most nights, 7:00 10:00 pm
 - Visit with guests, play games, and share conversation
 - On one night, churches are encouraged to host a special evening activity, such as board games, live music, or another fun event.

The shelter can accommodate up to 35 guests, but the exact number of neighbors we will serve will be communicated in the days leading up to our week.

Contributing Stocks or Bonds

To contribute capital gain property such as stocks or bonds to the church, per IRS Publication 526 you can deduct the Fair Market Value of the asset on your personal tax returns - not the basis in the asset. Immanuel has a brokerage account to facilitate the transfer of these assets directly. If you are interested, please contact the church for information or assistance.

Tax Break for Contributions -people over 70 1/2 years-old

If you are over 70.5 did you know that you can give directly from your retirement account to Immanuel Lutheran Church and pay no taxes on the gift? Due to the tax changes that include a higher standard deduction and the elimination of the personal exemption, you may receive the best tax benefit if you donate directly from your retirement account.
